We will experience the written language together through chapter read-alouds, reading to ourselves and to one another, in search of books that captivate us to encourage a lifelong love of reading. In math class, we will implement a hands-on approach, using manipulatives and games along with independent daily work while building a solid foundation in number sense. It is my mission to teach with such passion and dedication that all my students will develop the desire to be lifelong learners.

Some of you may already know me, but for those who are new, allow me to introduce myself. My name is Susan, and I have been a part of the North Branch family since my oldest child started in Nursery. She is now a freshman at Hollins University, and I have two other children, one who also attends North Branch. My eldest son is currently a rising freshman at Nelson County High and my youngest is a student at North Branch.
