## **Upcoming Important Dates & Information**

If you have any remaining paperwork, it needs to be turned into the office before **August 29th**, the first day of school.

Grown-ups walk their children into the classroom where they are greeted and checked in, and help them with placing their belongings into their cubby. All children need to be encouraged to use the bathroom and wash hands before heading out with grown-ups to the playground, where they are greeted by teachers.

**Departure:** Grown-ups arrive for pick-up at 12:30.

<u>Upcoming Playdate:</u> On Tuesday, August 20 from 10:00-11:30. This playdate is for Preschool and Early Primary students and families. It is a great way for everyone to meet each other, and for the kids to become familiar with their new classmates, teachers and school. There will be lots of fun things to do on the playground, and sweet watermelon too.

<u>Home Visits:</u> The home visit is a wonderful opportunity to spend time with new children and families, getting to know one another, and to engage with your child in the comfort of their own environment. There will be a sign-up sheet for home visits at our play date on Tuesday, August 20th.

## 2024 - 2025 Preschool Supply List

Please provide each of the following items for your child:

- Outside Shoes please have your child wear appropriate shoes for outdoor play. These should be closed toe with good grip for running, climbing, etc.
- Inside shoes comfortable, easy slip off and on, closed toe and will stay on feet! (Crocs are a great option)
- Spare change of clothes in a plastic bag (ziplock/grocery) to stay at school (including undergarments).
- Rain boots and raincoat with a head covering can be left in cubby or brought in on inclement days.
- Lunchbox/bag labeled with child's name and date
- Morning snack (please pack separately from lunch and put into provided snack bag located in your child's cubby)
- Water bottle with closed spout, labeled with child's name and date to go home and come back each day
- One box of crayons (24 pack)
- One box of markers (washable & unscented)
- One box of colored pencils
- Watercolors
- Scissors

The following is a list for general classroom use. We will use these items throughout the year. You may bring in one, some, all, or none of these items... Whatever works for your family!

- Glue sticks
- Tissues
- Any/all size zipper storage bags (off brand is fine)
- 13 gallon trash bags
- Baby Wipes (unscented)
- White Rice for our sensory table
